## Ponderings From Pam

### A LEGACY OF CHANGE...

In April, 2003, a small group of people began talking about the possibility of a Christian Women's Job Corps (CWJC) site in Waco, Texas. As I look back at the last 14 years, the prominent word that comes to mind is **"Change."** Of the many definitions given in the dictionary for that word, the one that most applies to CWJC is **"to become different, or make something or somebody different."**

The first evident change was in me. After being a stay-at-home mom for 20 years, becoming the executive director of a non-profit ministry was not even on my radar. However, God took this willing vessel and used me to produce many more changes. He opened the door for people in our community to experience change as they volunteered for the first time and discovered that you can receive a blessing in the midst of donating your time to help others.

The women who participated in our program experienced numerous changes:

- Finding hope in the future rather than despair and depression
- Being in a healthy relationship rather than in an abusive relationship
- Respecting herself rather than believing the ridicule and criticism from others
- Earning a GED rather than being a high school dropout
- Securing a job that paid the bills rather than a minimum wage job
- Completing an associate's or bachelor's degree after the CWJC program
- Becoming a contributing member of our community rather than depending on government subsidies

Those are only a few of the changes we've witnessed. Our Board of Directors decided this year we should celebrate **"A Legacy of Change."** The theme will carry over to our Baskets of Hope fundraiser. At the event, you will have an opportunity to hear from some of our participants, volunteers, and others in our community about changes they have experienced through their involvement with CWJC. We'll also share exciting changes we'll be making in the future. I hope you'll make plans to join us on September 26, at Woodway First Baptist Church, at 6:30 p.m.
